

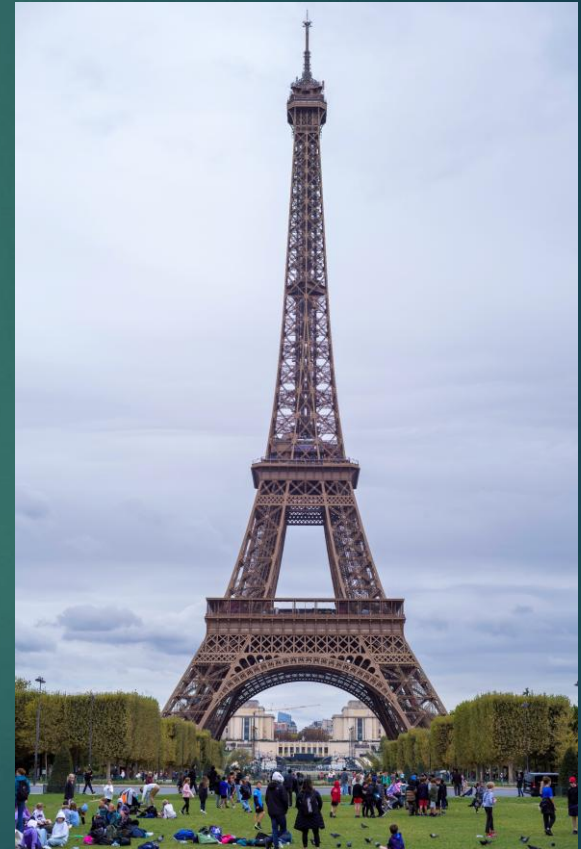

Our Trip Preparation

▶ Accommodation

- Children have been allocated pods and will be sharing with at least one child of their choice.

▶ Activity Groups

- Children have been allocated their group and group leader – where possible, we will ensure they have at least one friend in their group.

▶ Behaviour

- Children will be reminded that they are representing The Chandler during their time away and that the usual high standards of behaviour will be expected throughout the residential.

▶ Risk Assessments

- All travel, trips and activities have been risk assessed and agreed by the Educational Visits Officer at SCC.

▶ Independence

- Being on time, organising themselves with what they need each day etc

Preparation by Friday 11th September...

- ▶ Any medication to office with completed consent forms
- ▶ All completed medical information forms returned to office by Friday 11th Sept
- ▶ All GHIC cards to office (children can not travel without one) by Friday 11th Sept
- ▶ All pocket money paid £22 by Friday 11th Sept

Equipment

- ▶ Sleeping bag, pillow and 2 towels
- ▶ Day bag
- ▶ Food & Drink – packed lunch, water bottle and mid-morning snack for outward journey
- ▶ **No** electronic games or mobile phones
- ▶ Sun cream
- ▶ Mosquito repellent

Optional extras

- ▶ Disposable or cheap cameras
- ▶ Reading books / travel games / notebook and pen
- ▶ No sweets or food in luggage
- ▶ Hair dryers (and adapter) but no straighteners!

Essential Clothes

- ▶ Waterproof coat
- ▶ Comfortable shoes (trainers, etc.)
- ▶ Warm sweater

Children will be spending a large proportion of time outside either on trips or participating in evening activities so pack accordingly.



Please bring a packet of biscuits for communal use (no nuts)

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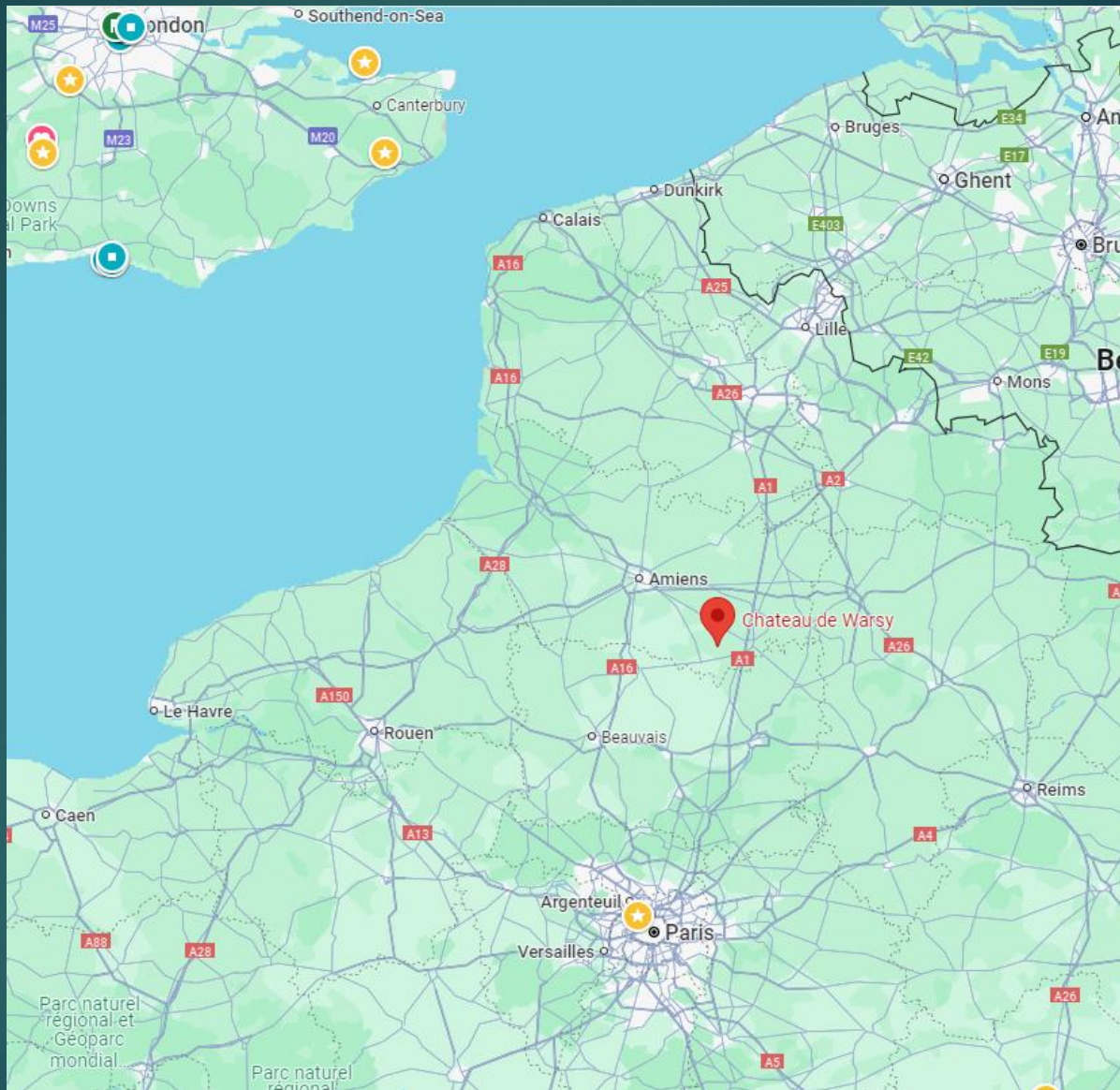
Day of Departure

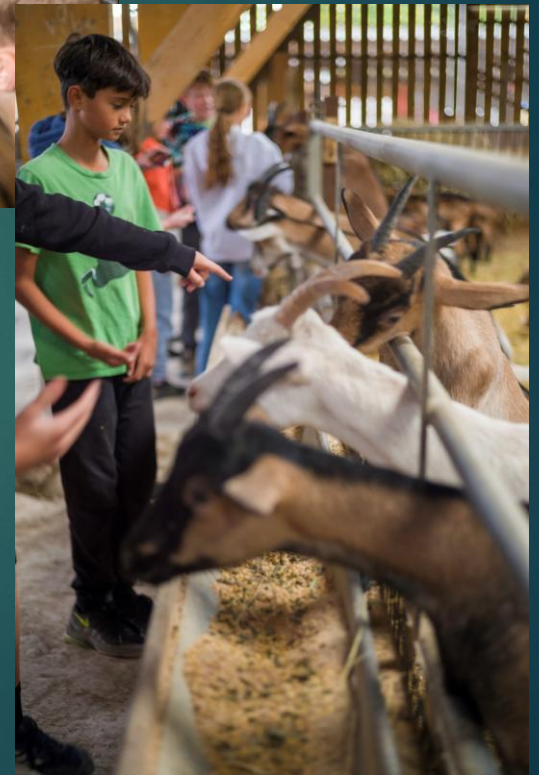

Breakfast (*Petit Déjeuner*)

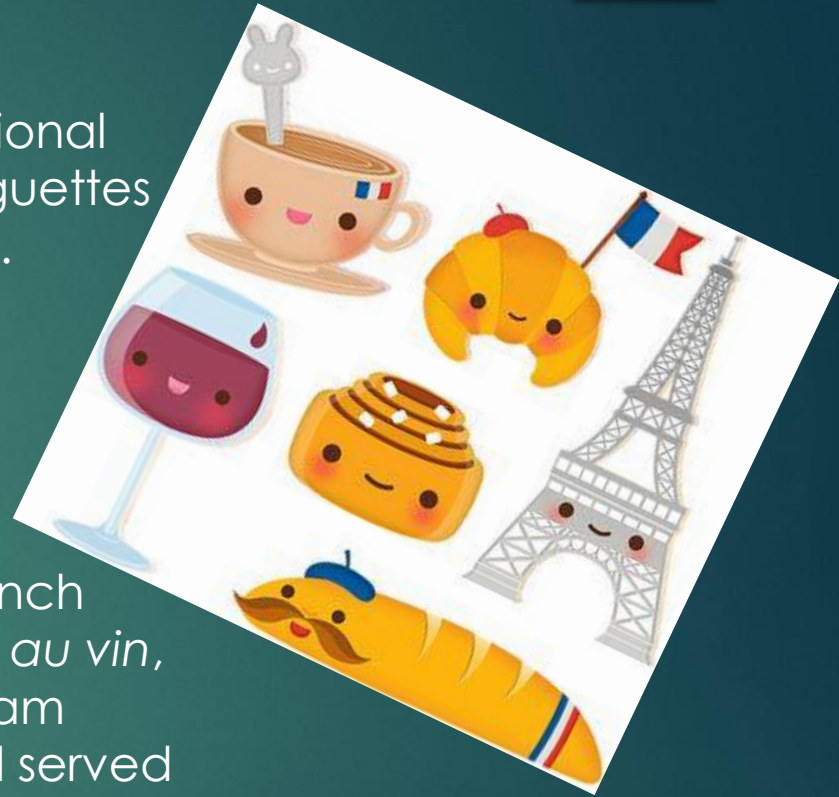
Fresh croissants, pain au chocolat, traditional brioche, a variety of cereals, French baguettes with jams, fruit juices, and hot chocolate.
